## EXPRESSIONS FOR MAKING, ACCEPTING, AND REFUSING A REQUEST POLITELY

#### Introducing an Issue

- There's something I'd like to discuss.
- (Indirect) I'm afraid there is a slight problem with [my schedule].
- (Direct) I want to complain about [my schedule].

#### **Making Requests**

- I was wondering if it would be possible to......
- I believe I'm entitled to/I deserve..... (a pay raise/a day off)

### Language to use to show understanding/agreement on a point:

- That's a fair suggestion.
- So what you're saying is that you...
- In other words, you feel that...
- You have a strong point there.

#### Language to use for objection on a point or offer:

- I understand where you're coming from; however,...
- I'm prepared to compromise, but...
- The way I look at it...
- If you look at it from my point of view, ...
- That's not exactly how I look at it.
- I'd have to disagree with you there.
- I'm afraid that doesn't work for me.

#### **Rejecting Requests**

- I'm afraid that's just not possible at the moment.
- That's out of the question. (strong)
- I'm afraid I have to turn your request down.
